- Final steps of becoming the first Wood County fire/EMS department to participate in the Leave it Behind program, providing free Narcan kits to patients' families. We have an individual coming in to talk to crews on May 8 to share his personal story of how kits like these saved his life and allowed him to recover from his addiction.
  - No cost to Lake Township
    - Through the Toledo-Lucas County Health Department
- With help from Springfield Township Fire Department:
  - Planning a Stop the Bleed instructor course in-house
  - New partnership will allow us to use their Stop the Bleed equipment, fire extinguisher trainer as needed
- Involved in Safe Kids of Greater Toledo, including Car Seat Fitting program and a Fire, Home, and Water Safety meeting.
- Working with the American Red Cross on a smoke alarm program
- AEDs for the Community Program:
  - o St. Peter's Church Millbury going to receive one
  - o CPR/AED/First Aid class has been scheduled for the leaders and congregation

#### Community Paramedicine

- Finalizing plan to have a recurring monthly talk on various topics at the Walbridge Senior Center (fall prevention, first aid, kitchen safety, etc.)
- March 24: Participated in Big Wheels Deliver Meals with Karen Baron, taking the opportunity to talk to
  residents about what they would like to see from the department and any needs requiring specific help.
  Received positive and helpful feedback.

#### Outreach

- Scheduled a Touch-a-Truck event with the Walbridge Library for July
- Continuing to attend Music in the Park meetings

#### LOGISTICS SECTION

#### Capt. Brandon Rosebrock

- Medic 27 had a flashing check engine light alert. Towed to Brondes in Maumee; two coil assemblies replaced
- Reallocated iPads to give every staff vehicle and first-out rig an MDT at minimal cost of one new mounting bracket
- Purchased new four-gas meter to replace obsolete unit
- Purchased cases for four-gas meters on Medic 26, Engine 28, Ladder 28 and Engine 27. This ensures dirt and debris stay out of the sensors and protects them from being damaged, prolonging their service life.
- Purchase Thermal Imaging Camera for Medic 26 as they arrive first at structure fires
- Ergonomic Tool straps purchased for the extrication tools to assist in handling the heavy equipment
