Community Paramedicine

Coordinator Becky Rosebrock

- **General**
 - On 11/13-14, Coordinator Rosebrock attended the Youth Firesetter Intervention Specialist Class at the Ohio Fire Academy, with no cost for tuition or lodging. Coordinator Rosebrock is now officially certified and can offer assistance in the community and surrounding areas.
 - Working to build partnerships with local businesses and nonprofits to help find resources for citizens at risk of becoming patients.
 - Continuing work with Safe Kids of Greater Toledo for fire prevention education, along with home and water safety materials. This includes obtaining a Big Max book, which is geared toward school-aged children. Active in revamping the Max program, including Recycling to the Max and Safety to the Max.
 - Developing a carbon monoxide community awareness program with the National Carbon Monoxide Awareness Association and the CO Coalition/
- **CPR Training**
 - Nothing to report.
- **Opioids**
 - 1 overdose; patient declined Leave it Behind kit
- **Cardiac Arrest Registry to Enhance Survival (CARES) Program**
 - One cardiac arrest report submitted

- **Stop the Bleed**
 - Nothing to report

- **Infant Safe Sleep**
 - Working with Lucas County Health Department (who provides the Infant Safe Sleep program in Wood County) in getting educational information, cribettes that can be handed out to individuals who cannot offer a safe place for infants to sleep.
 - Incorporating the DOSE (Direct On Scene Education) training. Coordinator Rosebrock and FF/EMT Mike Brasington are certified to teach the DOSE program, allowing them to educate parents on scenes or if specifically requested by other crews.

- **Senior Citizen Safety**
 - One hearing-impaired smoke alarm installed
 - Batteries replaced in a citizen's smoke alarms
 - Walbridge Senior Center "Cooking/kitchen Fire Safety" talk - Individuals requested a fire extinguisher training class because most don't know how to use one. In the process of getting this scheduled for spring time. CO alarms were also talked about and requested. We are working on getting some CO alarms for distribution
