- **New Medic Unit**
  - Cots are backordered – delivery expected the week of 10/23.
  - Once the cot arrives, we will be able to place the medic in service.
  - Bins and other minor equipment needed for the new medic unit were ordered. Medications and supplies were also ordered.
- HazMat IQ kits have been completed and placed on front line apparatus. It was found that while we participated in the regional program to give our responders a clear idea of the dangers they are entering to make a rescue at a hazardous materials scene, we did not have the equipment to match. This came to light after the semi vs. train on Fostoria Rd.
- Updated reference guides have been completed and placed in apparatus. These will assist crews in requesting additional resources.
